# **Conventional vs. Open Topics**



- Conventional Topics
  - -identify a specific Naval problem
  - -a desired technical objective
  - -an output
- Open Topics
  - -identify mission critical needs
  - -soliciting proposals to adapt commercial products or solutions
    - to close capability gaps
    - $\circ$  improve performance
    - o or provide technological advancements in existing capabilities

# Participating System Commands



**Marine Corps** 

Ground weapon and information technology programs for the Marines

### Naval Air Systems Command (NAVAIR)

Naval aviation aircraft, weapons, and systems operated by Sailors and Marines

### Naval Sea System Command (NAVSEA)

Engineers, builds, buys and maintains ships, submarines and combat system

## Naval Information Warfare System Command (NAVWAR)

Capable and secure communications and networks that span platforms and facilities

# **DoN Open Topics**



- Seeking commercial solutions:
  - Manuf. Readiness Level 8/9 (Low Rate Initial Production / Full Rate Production)
  - COTS/NDI that require RDT&E engineering, design or integration
- Mission critical needs:
  - Logistics in a Contested Environment
  - Holistic Common Operational Picture
- Technical focuses:
  - Renewable Energy Generation and Storage
  - Trusted AI and Autonomy
  - Advanced Computing and Software
  - Integrated Sensing and Cyber
  - Sustainment

# Eligibility



- Must qualify as a small business concern as defined by 13 CFR 121.702:
  - Organized for profit, with a place of business located in the United States
  - More than 50% owned and controlled by one or more individuals who are citizens or permanent resident aliens of the United States, or by other small business concerns that are each more than 50% owned and controlled by one or more individuals who are citizens or permanent resident aliens of the United States; and
  - No more than 500 employees, including affiliates
- Must meet the commercialization and transition rate benchmark requirements as determined by the SBA.
- For DoN, an awardee may be owned and controlled by more than one VC, hedge fund, or private equity firm so long as no one such firm owns a majority of the stock [15 U.S.C. 638(dd)(1)]

# **Performance Requirements**



- A minimum of two-thirds of the research and/or analytical work in Phase I must be conducted by the proposing small business concern.
- All work must be performed in the United States.
- Primary employment of the principal investigator must be with the proposing small business concern at the time of the award and during the conduct of the proposed effort.



Foreign nationals or individuals holding dual citizenship:

- -May be proposed as key personnel
- —Must be identified if a direct employee, subcontractor, or consultant
- -Must have their level of involvement on the project explained
- —May be **restricted** due to the technical data under US Export Control Laws on topics restricted under the International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR)

# **DoN-Specific Phase I Requirements**



- Open Topic Proposal Template: <u>https://navysbir.com/links\_forms.htm</u>
- May submit only one (1) proposal per open topic
- Phase I feasibility
  - Base: 4-month, \$75K
  - Option: 6-month, \$100K
- May not propose Technical and Business Assistance (TABA)
- May not propose Government Furnished Equipment (GFE)
- Do not recommend proposing use of Human Subjects, Animal Testing, or Recombinant DNA

# Volume 5 Requirements



#### **Required:**

- Contractor Certification Regarding Provision of Prohibition on Contracting for Certain Telecommunications and Video Surveillance Services or Equipment
- Disclosures of Foreign Affiliations or Relationships to Foreign Countries
- Disclosure of Funding Sources

### **Required**, as applicable:

- SBIR VC Certification Majority Ownership in Part
- SBIR/STTR Funding Agreement Certification
- Data Rights Assertion
- Allocation of Rights
- Disclosure of Information
- Additional Cost Information to support the Cost Volume
- Information on Foreign Citizens



## As specified in DoD Preface, Section 6.0

- Technical Merit (most important)
- Qualifications of Key Personnel
  Commercialization Potential

Equal Importance

# Phase II Overview



- Instructions included in Phase I award
- Initial Phase II Proposal due at the end of Phase I Base
- Competitive selection based on Initial Phase II Proposal and Phase I Final Report
- Same evaluation criteria as Phase I
- Phase I Option exercised if selected for award
- Awards are typically a Cost Plus Fixed Fee contract but
  may consider other types of agreement vehicles
